## ***A Message from the Board President***

Change is all around us. Overwhelming to some, thrilling to others, the word "change" is defined by the dictionary as a verb meaning to "alter in condition." At Indian Trails Public Library District, change is happening all the time, but with the goal of making Indian Trails *your go-to place for information, leisure pursuits, and lifelong learning!*

## **New Leadership**

The April Trustee elections brought changes to the Library Board. Donald Roalkvam, who served as Board President for six of his twelve years has retired from the Board, but will continue to represent Indian Trails Library as the delegate from Indian Trails for ILA's Executive Board and Councilor for the American Library Association. The Board welcomes **Louise Barnett** who has years of library experience and has been an avid supporter of Indian Trails. (See related article this page.)

Director **Tamiye Meehan** retired in June after 12 years of establishing our library as a leader in technology and community outreach throughout the state. Her vision, coupled with her tenacity for financial stewardship, allowed the library to provide cost-effective, new and innovative services.

We sincerely appreciate Don and Tamiye's commitment and contributions to making Indian Trails the outstanding library it is today. They leave a legacy that demands we keep on changing to meet the needs and expectations of our valued patrons.

## **Enhancing our Lobby**

Changes to the library's entrance and the introduction of Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) were just the beginning. The second phase of remodeling, now underway in the check out, reference, and computer areas on the first floor, will not only improve traffic flow in and out of the building, but also provide creative customer service, while making more DVDs, Blu-rays, and other materials easily available.

## **Reading Garden Coming**

In September, the Foundation will launch a new campaign: Support – Honor – Remember to establish a Reading Garden beginning in Summer 2010. This will provide community members an opportunity to honor a special person or celebrate milestones and support the library at the same time. Purchase a donor brick engraved with your honoree's name or a message that will be a part of the Reading Garden. ## ***Library Director Announcement***

The Indian Trails Public Library District Board of Trustees announces the selection of a new director, Thomas C. Simiele, effective September 14, 2009. Mr. Simiele comes to Indian Trails from the most recent post of Deputy Director of the Euclid Public Library in Euclid, Ohio, with prior experience as the Director of Bristol Public Library and Museum in Bristolville, Ohio. He has also held posts as a reference Librarian at Case Western Reserve University and the Business Manager of the Maple Heights City School District. Mr. Simiele has also practiced law for over 23 years, both in private practice specializing in real property tax, construction and public sector law, as well as General Counsel for the Cleveland City School District.

Mr. Simiele holds a Bachelor in Arts in History from Borromeo College (Wickliffe, Ohio), a Juris Doctor from Case Western Reserve University, and a Master of Library & Information Sciences from Kent State University. He is a member of Beta Phi Mu, the national honor society for librarians.

At the Bristol Public Library and Museum, he received grant funding for a mobile computer lab and acquired and installed a new Integrated Library System (ILS) system. He enhanced relationships with the school district and established a rotating collection for local Amish Schools.

While at the Euclid Public Library, Simiele actively sought grant funding for solar and wind powered energy sources for the library, and has been in the process of developing a large photo-voltaic solar array in a joint

venture with the Library and the City. He also spearheaded new programs for teens including the planning for a new teen center.

He is currently serving on the Action Council of the Management and Administration Division of the Ohio Library Council and is presently editing a portion of the Ohio Library Administrators Management Guide.

Simiele was formerly a City Councilman in Fairview Park, Ohio, Assistant Council for Republic Steel Corp., and General Council of the Cleveland City School District for 11 years.

He has been an active member in a number of organizations serving youth in the greater Cleveland area. His accomplishments are many including serving as President of the Board of the Spaulding Institute for Children, being named Distinguished Councilman, and receiving the Trustee of the Year award from Beech-Brook, Inc. Simiele has been active in the Boy Scouts of America where as a youth he earned the rank of Eagle Scout and as an adult was awarded the honor of the Silver Beaver by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

"I respect the past, but build the future on its foundations" said Simiele. "My goal is to not only celebrate our past successes, but to increase the quality and the number of services our library provides to all in our community."

Let our corporate sponsors who are listed on the Bookmobile and on the Bookmobile schedule know you appreciate their efforts by supporting their products and services.

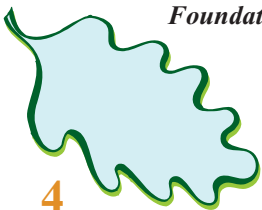

## **Reversing Your Perception of Art**

**John Green**, of Buffalo Grove, has traveled all seven continents, visited 40 countries, explored 43 states, and been to what he calls all five oceans. As an artist and architect, Green's pen and sketchpad have been his eyes to the beauty he has seen throughout the world. He has experienced a Buddhist Teschu ceremony in the Bhutan Himalayas, been among the penguins in Antarctica, witnessed a tribal dance in the Dogan colonies of Africa, and ridden a camel in Timbuktu.



Green will share his worldly adventures, mementos and sketches from **6:00 to 9:00 p.m.** on **Saturday, October 3rd**, at a champagne and chocolate event "Reversing Your Perception of Art" at the Indian Trails Public Library District, 355 S. Schoenbeck Rd. in Wheeling. **Admission is \$25 per person. Make checks payable to the Foundation for the Indian Trails Public Library District.**

Using a pen, Green, who has more than 400 artistic works to his credit, creates his pieces using shading techniques capturing everything from the subtlety of delicate plants to the great pillars of lost civilizations with a rare definition. Since beginning his career as an architect in 1973 upon graduating from Illinois Institute of Technology, he has designed several buildings in Buffalo Grove including the Golf Dome, 801 McHenry Road, and Village Hall, 50 Raupp Boulevard. He is also the owner of Groundwork, Ltd. and the Green Ink Art Gallery, both located at 351 W. Dundee Road in Buffalo Grove.

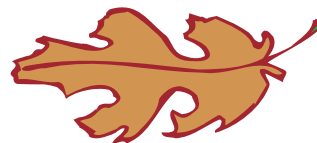
## Indian Trails Launches InfoXpress

- When you call and ask a staff member to put you on the list, ask them to write **24 Hour** in the Comment section and specify your preferred contact method.
- When you get the automated call saying that your request is waiting for you, call the library and ask that we put the item in the **24 Hour Pick-up lockers**.
- If you call to ask if the movie or book you need is in, and it is, ask to have it placed in the **24 Hour Pick-up lockers**.

When the item is ready for pick up, the item will be checked out to your account, you will be assigned a code, and then you will be notified either by e-mail or phone that you have three days to pick up the item.

It's that easy! The lockers will also work when we're open to save you time when you need it! Punch in your assigned code, remove your materials, and you're set!

The **24 Hour Pick-up lockers** are located on the front of the building, next to the materials return slot.
