Library Director to Retire

After serving the Indian Trails Public Library District for 12 years, Tamiye Meehan announced she will retire effective June 28,

2009. "Indian Trails Public Library District and its three communities hold a special place in my heart and I will continue to be willing to help the library in any way I can," Mrs. Meehan said.

In her 12 years as Director, circulation has doubled, the staff has been reorganized to better handle demands of a growing library, the collection has grown to include four additional languages, and service has grown to more than 40,000 people monthly. In addition, the number of library programs more than doubled under her command. Mrs. Meehan worked diligently to provide services that positively impact the communities served by the library, including the addition of the library's Bookmobile five years ago.

"She has made a tremendous impact on Indian Trails Library and the communities in which the library serves," said Donald Roalkvam, Indian Trails Public Library District's outgoing Board President. "She has been instrumental in working on so many of the good things that have happened in this library. She will be missed."

"As a result of our Director's efforts, state legislators now recognize Indian Trails Public Library board members and ask for their opinions on library-related legislation," said Sally Decker Smith, Indian Trails Special Services Librarian.

Mrs. Meehan has been actively involved with the Buffalo Grove and Wheeling Chambers of Commerce, Prospect Heights Dollars for Scholars, and Rotary Club of Wheeling, where she served a term as president. She also was treasurer and served a one-year term as president of the Illinois Library Association. She has been working for libraries in the Chicago area for more than 35 years.

The Indian Trails Public Library Board has begun a search for a new director and hopes to have the position filled soon.

Board of Trustees President Says Goodbye

Indian Trails Public Library District Board Member Donald Roalkvam said goodbye to the Board of Trustees on Wednesday, May 20th, at his final board meeting after 14 years of service.



Since 1995, Mr. Roalkvam has been recognized not only for his commitment to libraries, but also for his leadership and outstanding achievements. He has served three terms as president of the Board for Indian Trails Public Library.

Active on national, state, and regional library boards, president of the North Suburban Library System Board, executive committees, and task force groups, Roalkvam has served as President of American Library Association's Association for Library Trustees and Advocates (ALTA). He has worked tirelessly on getting legislation to include libraries for more funding. In 2006, he served as Program Chair for the American Library Association's Annual Conference in New Orleans and escorted guest speaker Madeleine Albright, the first woman to become United States Secretary of State into the conference.

In 2007, Roalkvam was the recipient of the Illinois Library Trustee of the Year Award. Mr. Roalkvam was replaced on the library board by Louise Barnett who was sworn in May 20th.

- In 2008, for the first time in the library's history, the public borrowed over one million items out of a collection of more than 257,000 books, CDs, and DVDs.
