7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

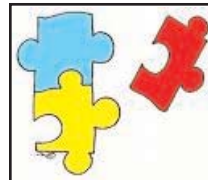

Reminding Americans not to take this precious democratic freedom for granted, *Banned Books Week* celebrates the freedom to choose or the freedom to express one's opinion even if that opinion might be considered unorthodox or unpopular. Take a look at the Banned Books display in the Front Room of the library during the month of September, and check out a banned book to read for yourself!

Live Homework Help (On-Line)

Ever have a difficult assignment and need some one-on-one help with it? The library can help you. All you need is a PC computer – at the library or at home. Tutors are available to help you, via instant messaging, on the topics of English, Math, Science and Social Studies, and will help 4th – 12th graders. This service is available seven days a week from 2:00 to 10:00 p.m. It is also available in Spanish (Math and Science only) Sunday through Thursday from 2:00 to 9:00 p.m. (Disponible a usted en Español [Matemáticas y Ciencia] de Domingo a Jueves entre las 2:00 p.m. a 9:00 p.m.)

Simply log onto the library's website (www.indiantrailslibrary.org) and click on "Resources", then open "Homework Help". Enter your Indian Trails library card number (with no spaces), and click "login". You may need to download Shockwave Player (this is necessary to use tutor.com). You can find the free download at www.macromedia.com. Choose your subject and grade and in a short time you'll be chatting on-line with a tutor.
