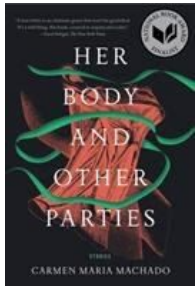

Below are recommendations for horror books that will give you a fright. Find one bloodcurdling book and check it out!

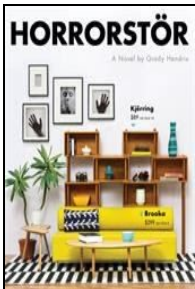


Her Body and Other Parties

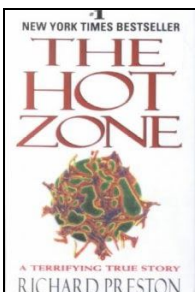


Horrorstör

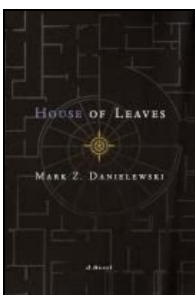


The Hot Zone

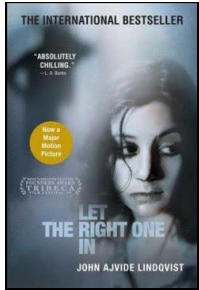
House of Leaves

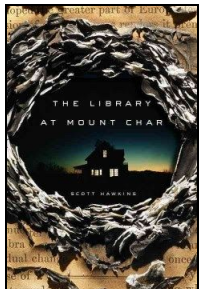




Let the Right One In

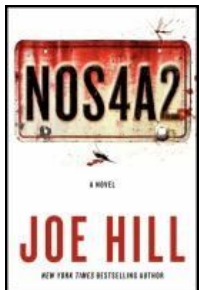

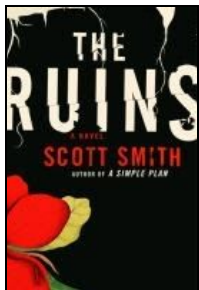

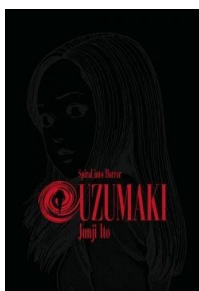
