ITPLD Local Government Efficiency Committee Report March 2024

As per the requirements of the Decennial Committees on Local Government Efficiency Act, the ITPLD Local Government Efficiency Committee was formed on May 17, 2023, and met on June 7, 2023, October 4, 2023 and March 6, 2024 to review and discuss information about the library district's governing statutes, ordinances, rules, procedures, powers, jurisdiction, shared services, intergovernmental agreements, and interrelationships. The following sections outline information discovered about the library district's core services, agreements, partnerships, policies, procedures and awards.

Summary Report: Overall, the Committee was impressed by the number of partnerships and agreements with government agencies and organizations within the community. The Committee did note a few potential ideas for future consideration, such as exploring how area organizations can work together to support teens using Horizon Park, working with District 21 to provide special needs training to library staff, developing a "wishlist" of service projects, providing Narcan training to staff, and developing the relationship with the Buffalo Grove social worker.

Overall, the Committee recommends that the library district continue to develop and create future partnerships to increase efficiencies between organizations while also providing needed services to the community.

General Information

The Indian Trails Public Library was established as a Library District in 1958. The purpose of the District is to provide library services to the residents of the District. The District serves most of the Village of Wheeling, half of the Village of Buffalo Grove, one third of the City of Prospect Heights, and a small portion of the Village of Arlington Heights, as well as some unincorporated Cook County areas. This is done through the main library building at 355 Schoenbeck Road, Wheeling, Illinois, and a branch location at 99 East Palatine Road, Suite A, Prospect Heights, Illinois.

Highlights:

- 1. Indian Trails Public Library District is located in Cook and Lake Counties.
- 2. The population of the Library District is 65,423 as of the 2020 Census.
- 3. The library district includes portions of Wheeling, Buffalo Grove, Prospect Heights and areas of unincorporated Cook County
- 4. ITPLD has 97 staff members (not including board members).
- 5. Our annual budget for FY23 is \$8,479,867.
- 6. Our library's equalized assessed evaluation (EAV) for 2021 is 1,627,944,098

Core Programs/Services

- 1. Checkout of books, DVD, BluRay, magazines, music CDs, audio books, video games, ebooks and audiobooks, LaunchPad kits, mobile hotspots, STEAM kits, ROKUs, laptops, themed backpacks, Lecture Series DVDs/CDs, print and AV ESL material, print and AV collections in Korean, Polish, Russian, Spanish and Ukrainian.
- 2. Adult programs such as entertainment, informational, genealogy, financial literacy, employment assistance, book discussions, movie presentation, current events, crafts, makerspace programs
- 3. Children programs such as Storytimes, age specific book discussions, entertainment, crafts, makerspace programs
- 4. Reference and reader's advisory assistance to members
- 5. Maker space-access to laser engraver, CNC, 3d printers, Sound Lab, video editing stations and 1-1 project appointments
- 6. Providing access to technology such as desktop computers, laptop computers, WiFi, copiers, printers, scanners, faxing services, projection systems, and software such as Microsoft and Apple products.
- 7. Providing research options such as print and online reference materials, online magazines, online newspapers, reputable online research resources, etc.
- 8. Service to teachers and local schools Provide bags of material on topics requested by teachers and do school visits to book talks and share about library resources and programs.
- 9. Museum Pass Programs Museum Adventure, Explore More Illinois, and Senator Johnson Museum Pass program
- 10. Study and meeting spaces
 - a. 3 public meeting rooms
 - i. 2 of the public meeting rooms can be combined to be a larger meeting space and accommodate up to 160 people.
 - b. I public conference room
 - c. 8 public study rooms
 - d. Quiet spaces such as our fireplace area.
 - e. Spaces for children and their caregivers to read and explore together in early learning space.
 - f. Dedicated space for Middle School students
- 11. Homebound services Delivery of material ITPLD homebound residents or residents living in an assisted living home.
- 12. English as a Second Language services
 - a. Large classroom programs for 3 different ability levels
 - b. One on one tutoring service
 - c. Dedicated lab space with dedicated computers and software to support student learning goals
- 13. Test proctoring services provide test proctoring services for students taking exams remotely.
- 14. Digital literacy and technology help for adults
 - a. Hands on training in dedicated Training Lab
 - b. One on One training for specific technology related questions
 - c. Large group lecture topics on specific technology related topics
- 15. 24/7/365 access to library resources through the library's website
- 16. Accessibility services available include electric scooters for in library use, low visions services and captioned, pre-recorded video programming. Library staff will attempt to provide additional program and service accommodations upon request.

Community Partnerships

- 1. **Foundation for the Indian Trails Public Library** Actively raises funds for requested library items/materials and advocates for the library in the community.
- 2. Annual Meeting between ITPLD Foundation, Board of Trustees and ITPLD library staff to connect and align goals and vision.
- 3. **Connecting Our Community** a network of ITPLD district area social service organizations, which meet twice a year to share resources and updates and discuss shared situations. The library facilitates and coordinates the meetings through our Outreach Services.
- 4. **Career Collab** The Lake Cook Career Collaborative is powered by a group of Chicago-area librarians with expertise in employment and career services. The Collaborative helps local residents who are unemployed or underemployed make their next career move by connecting them with expert-led workshops, online training and other resources offered at no cost through area public libraries. https://www.careercollab.org/about.html
- 5. Summer Lunches In 2018, the library coordinated with the Greater Chicago Food depository to distribute summer lunches to children at the library (through USDA and the state of Illinois). In 2019, the library coordinated with District 21 to distribute lunches at the main library and the branch location. Since 2020, District 21 has provided summer breakfast and lunch distribution in the library parking lot.
- 6. Local school districts 21 & 96- Library staff visit 12 elementary schools and 4 middle schools within Districts 21 and 96 to provide book talks, share readalouds and promote library services. During the 2022-23 school year, staff made 88 visits to District 21 and 96 classrooms and met with over 4,000 students. Library staff also attend school outreach events, such as back to school nights and literacy events, and host students for field trips within the library. Library information is shared with students and parents at outreach events in both English and Spanish, and with District 21 students through the virtual backpack platform. ITPLD also provides schools with both institute and teacher cards, allowing schools to check out library materials for extended periods and request book bags on specific topics.
- 7. **Local preschools** Library staff visit preschools within the district to present storytimes, promote library services, and provide early literacy information. Preschools can also obtain school library cards that allow staff to check out library materials, and request book bags on specific topics. During the 2022-23 school year, staff made 38 visits to local preschools, reaching over 800 students.
- 8. Wheeling Chamber of Commerce The library is represented as an associate member at monthly meetings. In addition, the library hosts some of the monthly director meetings free of room rental charges. Staff are encouraged to participate in events like the job fair at Wheeling High School and Taste of Town, a culinary tasting event featuring local Wheeling restaurant and catering businesses.
- 9. Wheeling Township The library regularly partners with the Wheeling Township to bring programming to our members as well as to support the local food pantry through drives at the library.
- 10. **Buffalo Grove Chamber of Commerce** The library is an associate member.
- 11. Village of Wheeling Economic Development The library partners with in-district businesses to promote job ads on the digital message board located in the main library café. An informational bookmark was developed to promote this free service and is included in the village's business development kit that is distributed to interested parties.
- 12. **Community Memory Café** (with Buffalo Grove Police, VAPLD, Sunrise Senior Living, Belmont Village, Buffalo Grove Parks and Rec) Together with community partners the library has created and participates in monthly Memory Café meetups for members of the community who have dementia and their caregivers.

- 13. **Craft for a Cause** This crafting group meets to create items such as port pillows, wash cloths, and animal toys for local nonprofits.
- 14. **University of Illinois iSchool** Partnered to obtain a \$100,000 grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Service to research how to measure impact and value of public library makerspaces on communities (Measuring Makerspaces in Public Libraries).
- 15. **Census 2020** The library partnered with several local organizations as part of the Wheeling Census Counts Committee and the Lake Cook Census Collaborative to promote Census information, encourage participation for accurate community counts and provide space for Census training.
- 16. Buffalo Grove Police Department/Social Worker Library staff communicate with the Buffalo Grove police department and social worker as needed to discuss safety and member concerns.
- 17. Wheeling Police Department Wheeling Police Department officers have provided safety training sessions for library staff and feedback on library processes and procedures.
- 18. **Prospect Heights Police Department** The Prospect Heights Police Summer Youth Outreach Program builds positive and lasting relationships with the young members of the community and includes 4 trips to Chicagoland locations such as Wheeling Aquatic Center, Camp Duncan, Brookfield Zoo. Kids ages 8-15 enjoy the activities and learn to trust the police officers in the informal environment. Besides the library's financial contribution, the Branch staff help with promoting the program, registering the kids, and chaperoning.
- 19. **Homebound Facility Visits** The library visits in-district Retirement and Residency Facilities various times throughout the month to bring library materials for circulation, one on one technology support and promotion of other library services.
- 20. **Annual Giving Garden Programs** Program that invites University of Illinois Extension Master Gardener and Wheeling Garden Club volunteers to develop the garden and support programs that results in food donated to the Wheeling Township Food Pantry.
- 21. **Buffalo Grove Park District** Storywalk & Little Free Library The library district and ITPLD Foundation partnered with the Buffalo Grove Park District to install a Storywalk and Little Free Library in Reiner Park. We also provide a materials return drop off at the Alcott Community Center.
- 22. **Better World Books** Ships, processes, and sells discards and donations, then donates or recycles what's left for free. For every book sold, Better World Books donates a book to someone in need. Books are sold for what they are truly worth, thereby optimizing the revenue potential and supporting literacy initiatives through book donations.
- 23. **AARP Tax Assistance** We offer a list of local area AARP Tax assistance, along with providing members with pre-printed tax forms from the IRS as well as a free tax form printing station. This service is available Feb-April each year.
- 24. **Lake County Astronomical Club** Outfitted telescopes and instructions with ongoing maintenance provided through the LoanStar Telescope program; Star Maps and suggested objects to view each month and conducted programs.
- 25. Cook County Clerk Location for both Election Day and Early Voting for registered voters in Cook County
- 26. US Representative and IL State Representatives and Senators Location for Office Hours for congressional staff to meet with constituents.
- 27. Versiti Blood Center of Illinois Community Blood Drives
- 28. Village of Wheeling Social Services has provided staff training as well as scheduling social worker office hours at the library.
- 29. **Buffalo Grove Farmer's Market** Outreach event to support the work of the library in the community

- 30. Rotary Club of Buffalo Grove and Rotary Club of Wheeling Partner with the two local Rotary clubs to fund projects and services at the library.
- 31. **Reaching Across Illinois Library System (RAILS)** Received a continuing education grant to provide third-party harassment training to ITPLD staff and staff from area libraries.
- 32. National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Northwest Suburban coordinated Mental Health Awareness Training for ITPLD staff.
- 33. Partners for Communities/Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) Welcoming Center—participated in community discussions on supporting asylum seekers in Prospect Heights.
- 34. **Illinois Holocaust Museum** staff toured the museum exhibits as for staff training and development.
- 35. Village of Prospect Heights Fire the library served as a drop off point for donations which were shared with organizations to provide to fire victims. Library staff contacted ILA and coordinated donations of materials from the organization for victims of the fire.
- 36. Village of Buffalo Grove library provided village staff with computer instruction classes.
- 37. Wheeling Fire Department library hired them to offer CPR classes to in district members.
- 38. We Care Recycling Administration, LLC/Operating Helping Hands exterior clothes & shoes drop off donation box.
- 39. **Boy Scout Troop 468** Eagle Scout Will Snarski completed a service project that constructed the Giving Garden bed.
- 40. **HIAS Immigration & Citizenship** partnership providing biannual citizenship classes at the library.
- 41. Harper Community College Harper Promise Program library provides volunteer opportunities to high school students that can be applied to the Harper Promise Program.
- 42. **Prospect Heights Public Library** library coordinates to provide library card registration services to Prospect Heights library members at the Indian Trails library (and vice versa). PHPL also services all schools in District 23 per agreement with the library.
- 43. **Illinois Library Association** library staff are contributing to services to enhance library trustee training opportunities.
- 44. **K9 Reading Buddies of the North Shore** the library is coordinating with this organization to bring the dogs and their volunteer handlers to the library in the spring of 2024.
- 45. **Josselyn Community Mental Health Center** library coordinated with Josselyn to attend mental health training for teens program in January, 2024. Future training opportunities are being considered.
- 46. **Prospect Heights Piper Lane/Apple Drive Committee** library staff serve on this committee of community organizations connecting to serve the needs of residents in these areas of Prospect Heights.
