



Can't make it to the library with a parent or guardian to sign up for a library card? Don't let that stop you. If you are in high school, you can get an Indian Trails Public Library card on your own to access study spaces, digital tools and books.

Who is Eligible?

You can get this card if you meet all three of these requirements:

- **Grade:** 9-12.
- **Residency:** You live within the Indian Trails Public Library District boundaries. (Unsure if you do? Check the library website at itpld.info/librarycards)
- **Card Status:** You don't already have an Indian Trails library card.



What to Bring to Sign Up

You can register at the main Library, the Branch, or at any library outreach event. Just show us:

1. **A Photo ID** (like your school student ID card or driver's license).
2. **Proof of Address** (show us your name and address on the Infinite Campus app or your driver's license).

What You Can (and Can't) Do With Your Card

What's Included:

- **Digital Resources:** Full access to online databases, e-books and streaming tools.
- **Study Rooms:** Reserve quiet spaces to work or study.
- **Teen Space Perks:** Use video game controllers in the Teen Space.
- **Borrowing:** Check out up to 3 physical items at a time (limited to books, CDs and DVDs).

What's Restricted:

To offer this card without a parent's signature, certain services are restricted. This card **cannot** be used for:

- Checking out tech (Wi-Fi hotspots, laptops, tablets, AV equipment).
- Checking out specialty items (Launchpads, video games, STEAM Kits, Youth Packs).
- Interlibrary loans or borrowing items from other libraries.

Expiration & Upgrades

- **Upgrading Early:** You can upgrade to a standard library card at any time to unlock all borrowing privileges. Just bring a parent or guardian to sign the registration form.
- **Turning 18:** This card expires on your 18th birthday, at which point you can independently update your account to a standard library card.
