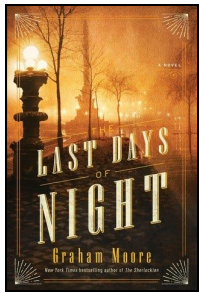

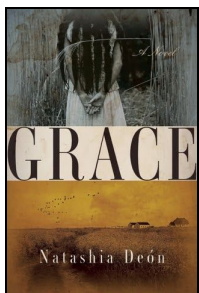
Below are recommendations for historical fiction books that take place before the year 1900. Find one that looks interesting and check it out!

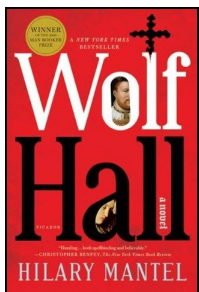

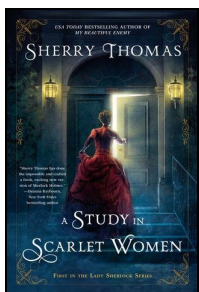

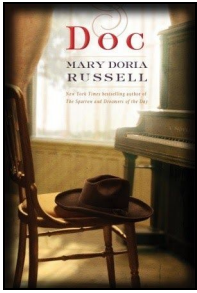

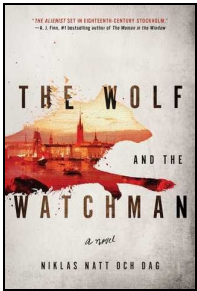

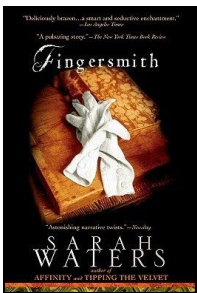

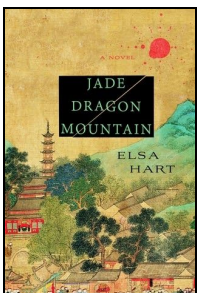

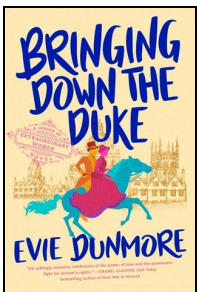
