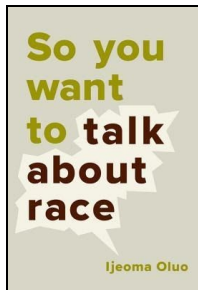

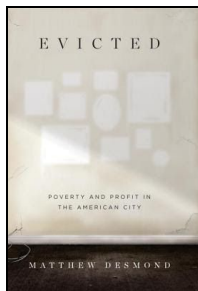


So You Want to Talk About Race

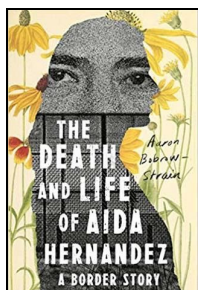

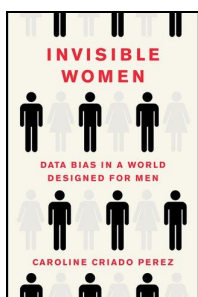

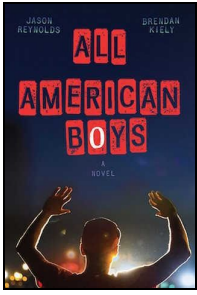

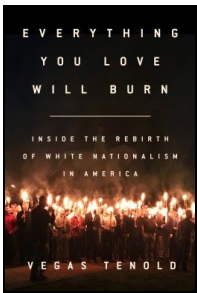

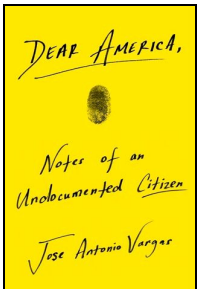

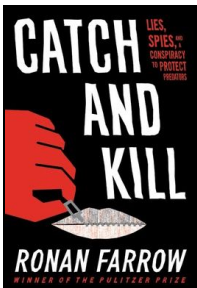
