






by Kristin Levine


Two girls form a strong friendship and learn to overcome their fears as they face conflict due to racial segregation in Arkansas.

by Jessica Day George



Life As We Knew It




An unlikely friendship between two girls who live very different lives helps both girls face adversity in their hometowns.

Counting by 7s



After a tragic accident kills both her parents, an incredibly intelligent girl finds a new family, her own place in the world, and her own way to be herself.








